Babasaheb Bhimrao Ambedkar University was established by an act passed by the parliament (No. 58 of 1994). The University came into existence on 10.01.1996 vide GOI, Ministry of HRD, Education Department Notification No. 8-16/GOI/desk/U-1 dated 05.01.1996. The basic philosophy and policies of the University are spelt out and enshrined in the University Act and Statutes. The University offers graduate and post-graduate students the knowledge and skills needed to succeed as persons and professionals, and the values and sensitivity necessary to serve the society. The University distinguishes itself as a socially responsible learning community of high quality scholarship and academic rigor sustained by social justice and equity principles for which Babasaheb Bhimrao Ambedkar worked during his lifetime. The University draws from the cultural, intellectual and economic resources of Uttar Pradesh and other states to enrich and strengthen its educational programs.

The University is preparing students from rural mainland of Uttar Pradesh in particular, and all parts of India in general, often coming from marginalized sections for leadership in a complex world.

It offers the kind of education needed through various inclusive, society-oriented programs for transforming our country in the disciplines of Humanities and Sciences, Engineering, Agriculture, Biotechnology, Business, Law, Education and Environmental Sciences – through a breadth of highly regarded degree programs that allow students the freedom to explore their intellectual and personal growth. The faculty members at our University accept their responsibilities conscientiously, share leadership in a democratic spirit, and maintain subject to the highest standards of public trust. University offers 99 courses that include Diploma/integrated PG Programmes/UG/PG and Ph.D. at its main campus and satellite centre at Amethi.

The University strives to fulfill the objectives of its inception. University provides 50 percent seats of all the courses reserved for the students of Schedule Caste and Schedule Tribes. Now with the government directives, University also offers 10 percent seats reserved for the Economically Weaker Section. The University also provides fee exemption for the students of the Schedule Caste and Schedule Tribes in regular courses. University also provides financial assistance to the Schedule Caste and Schedule Tribe students for their dissertation and thesis preparation. University also has a satellite centre at Amethi, started in the year of 2016. The University has a fully air conditioned and well-furnished Central Library namely Gautam Buddha Library having more than 50 thousand books and 10 thousand online journals along with departmental libraries in the respective departments to cater to the demand of the students pursuing studies in the University. The University has one health centre with availability of doctors round the clock. For overall development of the Students University has a Centre for Personality Development with Residential Coaching Programme (RCP) and Remedial Coaching Centre (RCA). The University has a Student activity centre which is likely to be functional.

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ADMISSION PROSPECTUS, 2026 FOR Ph.D. PROGRAMME

Important Instructions

1. All eligible applicants desire to seek admission to Ph.D. programme of the BABASAHEB BHIMRAO AMBEDKAR UNIVERSITY, Lucknow for the Year 2026 must read the contents of this prospectus carefully.
2. Changes made in any Ph.D. programme after the release of this prospectus shall become effective from the date it is posted on University website: <http://www.bbau.ac.in>.
3. The University reserves the right to revise, amend, update, or delete any part of this prospectus without giving any prior notice. Any change so made shall be updated on the university website.
4. Applicants are responsible for regularly checking the University website for any updates and grievances resulting from lack of reading/consulting this prospectus will not be entertained.
5. UGC-NET/UGC-CSIR NET/National level tests (whichever is applicable) score shall be used for admission to Ph.D. programme. The eligibility of NET qualified candidates for different categories is summarized below:

The University shall take Ph.D. admission in following orders.

1. From Category 1
2. From Category 2 & Category 3

2.1 Firstly, the JRF-qualified candidates will be admitted into the Ph.D. programme based on an interview as per Ph.D. Ordinance, 2026 of the University.

2.2 For Candidates who qualify in categories 2 and 3, 70% weightage will be given for test scores (National Level Test Score/Entrance Test Score) and 30% weightage for the interview for admission to Ph.D. programmes. The Ph.D. admission will be based on the combined merit of test scores (National Level Test Score/Entrance Test Score) and the marks obtained in the interview as defined in Ph.D. Ordinance, 2026. Candidates will be called for interview in 1:5 ratio based on declared number of category wise seats.

The marks obtained in the NET by the candidates in Categories 2 and 3 will be valid for a period of one year for admission to Ph.D.

2.3 Minimum and maximum marks under the category of C and D under the para 4.2.9 of Ph.D. Ordinance, 2026 awarded by the D.R.C. shall be 40% and 80% respectively. Marks granted by D.R.C. beyond the said limits to the candidates, reason for this must be recorded in the minutes of the D.R.C. of Department.

General Information

1. The applicant is provisionally allowed to appear for the interview/entrance test (whichever is applicable) and their candidature is subject to the fulfillment of the minimum eligibility criteria at the time of admission.
2. Admission of the candidates for Ph.D. programme is based on their suitability to specific specialization and also subject to fulfilling all other conditions laid down in the respective regulation of the BABASAHEB BHIMRAO AMBEDKAR UNIVERSITY.
3. The merit list for the unreserved category seats will comprise all the candidates in the order of merit including candidates under reserved category if they come in the unreserved merit. A candidate under reserved category, who figures in the unreserved merit list, is entitled to be considered for admission under the unreserved category. Admission to open category seats will be strictly in the order of merit without excluding candidates belonging to reserved category.
4. The Departments shall get verified the relevant certificates submitted by the applicant for availing the benefit of reservation.
5. Merit list for interview will be prepared based on the total marks obtained in entrance test (70% weightage), marks obtained in Bachelor's degree (2% weightage), Master's degree (3% weightage) and weightage for NET/M.Phil./JRF (JRF-10 marks, M.Phil+NET-7 marks, NET-5 marks).
6. Candidates will be called for interview in 1:5 ratio based on declared number of category wise seats.
7. All the essential qualifications including NET etc. will be considered till the last date of filing of online application.

Rules and Regulations

1. Each student is required to sign a declaration regarding discipline and conduct as per provisions of the Act & Statutes of the University.
2. The admission is liable to be canceled if any information/any document provided by the candidate, if found to be fake. Strict disciplinary action shall be taken against such candidates as per University rules.
3. The University reserves the right to change or modify the rules and regulations of the admission test.
4. On being selected for counseling, the selected candidates shall have to submit the self-attested copies/original of following documents on or before the last date prescribed for the purpose:
 - a. Mark Sheet/Grade Sheet of the qualifying degree course (self-attested).
 - b. Character Certificate from the Dean/Head/Principal of the University/Institution last attended (in original).
 - c. Migration Certificate from the competent authority of the University/Institution last attended.
 - d. SC/ST/PwD/Kashmiri Migrant/NRI Certificate issued by the Competent Authority (self-attested).
 - e. Candidates shall bring all the original certificates/documents for verification.

5. Applicants seeking admission to more than one course in the University have to submit separate application and Registration forms for each course.
They should take separate admission tests for each course.
6. For taking the Ph.D. entrance test, it is necessary that the candidates must have passed the PG degree course in the relevant subject/allied subject as listed at Annexure II from a University recognized by the University Grants Commission with 55% marks in aggregate or its equivalent grade 'B' in UGC 7-point scale (5% relaxation or equivalent grade shall be provided to SC/ST/OBC (non-creamy layer)/PwD).
7. The percentage of marks in the qualifying examination shall be read without rounding off the percentage.
8. Merely appearing in the entrance test does not entitle a candidate to claim admission.
9. Candidates against whom any disciplinary action has been taken at any stage in his/her earlier academic career shall not be admitted to any course in this University.
10. Enrollment of a student shall stand canceled if candidate is held guilty of any cognizable offence. Enrollment may also be canceled if candidate's conduct is found guilty by the University.
11. The University reserves the right to make any changes/ modifications in the provisions made in this prospectus.
12. No candidates shall be entitled to claim admission as a matter of right.
13. The criteria for qualifying examination for the Ph.D. programme are given in BBAU Ph.D. Ordinance.
14. The Departments of the University may ask the candidates concerned, wherever necessary, to get recognition/equivalence of their degrees/ diplomas/ certificates authenticated from the Association of Indian Universities/University Grants Commission/AICTE/Council of Boards of School Education in India (COBSE)/PCI/BCI on his/her own for the purpose of admission in the Department. Further, the cases of equivalence of degrees/certificates/diploma may then be put up before the University Authorities for further consideration and confirmation. However, the Certificates / Diplomas/ Degrees already recognized/equated by the University may not be referred for further verification.
15. University offers supernumerary seat to its' teaching and non-teaching permanent employees and their ward who fulfill basic eligibility as per Ph.D ordinance and secure 50% marks in National level examinations (45% in case of SC/ST/OBC-NCL/PwD). Each supervisor can guide up to two international scholars on a supernumerary basis over and above the permitted number of Ph.D. scholars subject to fulfilling the University guidelines for foreign students and due recommendation of **Coordinator, International Students Centre**.
16. All disputes pertaining to the conduct of entrance examination including results shall fall within the jurisdiction of Lucknow.

17. The merit list for the unreserved category seats will comprise of all the candidates in the order of merit including candidates under reserved category, if they come in the unreserved merit. A candidate under reserved category, who figures in the unreserved merit list, is entitled to be considered for admission under the unreserved category. Admission to unreserved category seats will be strictly in the order of merit without excluding candidates belonging to reserved category.
18. The Concerned Departmental Research Committee (D.R.C.) shall verify all the relevant certificates/documents submitted by the applicant.
19. The Merit list for interview will be prepared based on the total marks obtained in National Level Test Score/Entrance Test Score. Candidates will be called for interview in 1:5 ratio based on declared number of category-wise seats.
20. The basis of final shortlisting of candidates for admission will be on the merit of marks obtained in entrance test/ national level test, whichever application (70% weightage), and Interview (30%) put together. The DRC may hold the interview in hybrid mode to complete the admissions at the earliest. **The Interview component (30 marks) will comprise of-**

A. Weightage for Academics- 05 Marks

- Bachelor's degree (% of Marks obtained in UG X 2/100),
- Master's degree (% of Marks obtained in PG X 3/100),
or
- 04 Year Bachelor's degree (% of Marks obtained in 4 Year UG X 5/100)
- **Weightage for Fellowship etc. -10 Marks** JRF/Any other National level Fellowship -10 marks or
- M.Phil. +NET-7 marks or

In case of admission through entrance exam weightage for fellowship etc. shall not applicable instead weightage for Research proposal and personal interaction shall be 10 Marks and 15 Marks respectively.

Reservation Policy

The reservation policy to be followed for admission in academic session 2026-27 will be as per the provisions of the academic ordinance Chapter- VII (clause 9) “for the purposes of admission to all courses of study in the university, 50% of the seats shall be reserved for Scheduled caste/ Scheduled tribes (SC/ST) students” and 10% seats shall be reserved for Economically Weaker Sections (EWSs) for admissions in the University as per the letter of MHRD, F.No.19-4/2019-CU.Cdn dated 23.01.2019.

University Facilities

COMPUTER CENTRE

Presently University has a Computer Centre equipped with computers and internet facilities under the info net program of UGC scheme, which is open for all. The University is also connected with National Knowledge Network (NKN).

HEALTH CARE

The University provides health services through medical officers to all the students, administrative staff, faculty members, and subordinate staff and the residential students of the University. University has also established Yoga and wellness centre with the help of state government to provide alternative health care with dedicated instructors/consultants to all the staff and students.

INFORMATION & GUIDANCE BUREAU (I & GB)

In order to build their career, students need to know the options available to them and where and how they can achieve it. It is committed to do the needful for the benefit of the students. The main function of the bureau is to disseminate the employment information for various courses offered by the University. The students are explained about various job opportunities and schemes of competitive examinations and higher education in India and abroad. Tasks of the bureau are to conduct Career Conferences where eminent personalities from different walks of life will address the students, collect and display various career related information, provide handbooks of foreign Universities, newspapers, bulletin of sister bureau, Employment News and occupational information files for the reference of students. Further, it is also to render vocational guidance to the students individually or in group and to collect and disseminate the occupational information, training facilities, financial assistance available in India and abroad.

LAN/Wi-Fi

Most buildings in the University such as administrative blocks, departments, hostels, and some residential quarters in the campus are fully equipped with LAN facility. The state of the art Wi-Fi connectivity across the campus provides high-speed internet.

LIBRARY

The Gautam Buddha Central library is housed in a huge library building and fulfils its objective to supplement educational and information needs of the faculty and students through its books and periodical sections having adequate reading rooms, journals and video library. It is equipped

to facilitate visually handicapped students as well. The library services are also extended to non-teaching staff and visitors. It has adequate collection to satisfy the information need of the user.

GUEST HOUSE

The Guest House of the University is located within the University campus and is providing round the clock boarding and lodging services to Guests. Guest House rooms are allotted to University Guests free of cost and to other State or Central Govt. organizations, Universities, Public Sector Undertakings on request, subject to availability, on payment. However, first priority is given to the University activities.

MESS /CANTEEN

Mess facility is available in the University in all the hostels. A Canteen is also running in the campus during working days which is open for all.

UNIVERSITY PLACEMENT CELL (UPC)

Since its inception, the cell is helping the students placement in various organizations across India and abroad. The UPC is dedicated to support the students in their pursuit to get jobs in reputed organizations in India and abroad. Placement Cell also regularly organizes specialized lectures, workshops and job fairs to provide students a platform to showcase their talents.

SC/ST CELL

The staff of the cell is actively engaged in coordinating and solving the problems in the matter of admissions in the University, utilization and timely disbursement of scholarships, accommodation in hostels, conduct of remedial coaching, UGC-NET coaching, competitive exam coaching and other measures with a view to see that the education system succeeds in bringing the Schedule Castes and Scheduled Tribes to a level quantitatively as well as qualitatively at par with the rest of the society. The Cell is also instrumental in monitoring the implementation of rule of reservation for SC/ST in admissions and appointments in teaching as well as non-teaching posts. Further a Gold Medal also is awarded to topper among the SC/ST students.

COACHING CENTRE FOR SC/ST/MINORITIES

The University offers the following programmes for the development of SC/ST and Minority students.

1. **UGC Remedial Coaching Programme (RCP):** Under RCP, additional coaching is provided to the students who face difficulties in learning the

subjects concerned and English language. In addition, it conducts classes for personality development.

2. **Residential Coaching Academy:** This Programme offers special coaching for Civil Services (IAS/IPS/IFS), State Services, SSC, RRB and other competitive examinations which are being conducted by the Central and State Governments.

SPORTS

A healthy person keeps a healthy and active mind and sports are the best mechanism to accomplish that objective. The University, being sensitive for the overall development of students, realizes that a balance in physical, mental and emotional growth is essential for the complete development of personality.

At present, the University has a multipurpose sports ground in the campus having facilities for sports like football, volleyball, cricket, athletics etc. In addition, there is an indoor Gymnasium equipped with all modern facilities for physical training. Indoor games like Badminton, Table Tennis, Chess, and Carom facilities are available. All the games, indoor and outdoor, are facilitated by experts and trainers. University is sure that these facilities would instill in students a sense of confidence besides physical fitness. It would help them in becoming a complete human being so that they can withstand the challenges of life.

UNIVERSITY SCIENCE INSTRUMENTATION CENTRE (USIC)

As per the UGC's mandate, University has established University Sophisticated Instruments Centre (USIC) as central facility. In fact, the creation of such a center is obligatory for every university for the reason that the modern day science demands the use of precision equipments for the acceptability of data. Such centres help stop duplication of sophisticated equipment's, which cost huge amounts and in turn help in regulating the use of the sanctioned money in the most judicious way. This is housed on the ground floor of the School for Environmental Sciences building. USIC has five precision equipments:

1. Scanning Electron Microscope, (SEM, Model JSM-6490 LV of JEOL, and Japan) with EDX facility viz., Critical Point Dryer and Ion Sputter Coater;
2. Fourier Transform Infrared Spectrometer with ATR - Attenuated Total Reflectance (FT-IR Spectrometer, Model Nicolet TM 6700 OF Thermo Scientific, USA);
3. Fast Performance Liquid Chromatography (FPLC, Model EKTA 10 of GE Healthcare Bioscience. Sweden).
4. X-ray Diffractometer (XRD, Model: D8 Advance Eco, Bruker, Singapore)
5. Inverted Laser Scanning Confocal Microscope from Carl Zeiss India (Bangalore) Pvt. Ltd.
6. Preparatory HPLC from Spinco Biotech Pvt. Ltd

WOMEN CELL AND DAY CARE CENTRE

The University is doing a lot of work towards gender equality. As a path breaking decision, a provision of gender budgeting has been made on BBAU financial road map. Gender budgeting basically means that a part of the budget will be set aside for gender specific activities.

The University has basic facilities for the women employees and girl students including a day care center in the campus.

NATIONAL CADET CORPS (NCC) AND NATIONAL SERVICES SCHEME (NSS)

Training in NCC instills qualities like nationalism, patriotism, discipline, team spirit, spirit-de-corps, leadership and self-confidence and promotes overall personality development.
